Murrieta Police Department, CA was invited to apply for the FY 2019 NCS-X Implementation Assistance Program to support their efforts in obtaining a NIBRS ready Law Enforcement Records Management System. The grant

was supplied by the <u>U.S. Department of Justice</u> (DOJ), <u>Office of Justice</u> <u>Programs</u> (OJP), <u>Bureau of Justice Statistics</u> (BJS), in partnership with the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division. These entities are seeking applications for funding to support efforts of selected local law enforcement agencies (LEA) to report incident-based crime data to the FBI's National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). Under this solicitation, funding will be provided to support the transition to incident-based reporting (IBR) among LE agencies selected for participation in the National Crime Statistics Exchange (NCS-X) that currently do not report IBR data to their state Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program or the FBI's NIBRS. This program furthers the Department's mission to develop innovative strategies that support information sharing among sectors of the justice community.

Winbourne Consulting was hired to write the grant application for Murrieta Police Department. This project included researching the full aspects of the grant and ensuring that all qualifications needs were met and required information was documented. Winbourne coordinated with the selected Law RMS vendor on aspects of the grant. Completing the grant application required an understanding the requirements from the CA Department of Justice to implement and maintain a NIBRS compliant system.

Winbourne Consulting has been selected by the Springfield, Massachusetts Police Department to assist them in overseeing the department's implementation of body-worn cameras. The services to be provided as part of obtaining a new Body Worn Camera System include: RFI/RFP development, contract negotiation, implementation, and continued trainings. The services provided will be a comprehensive approach to the coordination and



administration of a Body Worn Camera system, including compliance verification processes and risk mitigation processes.

annual tradition of Valentine's Day with 911 friends in DC. Several of the notable events and discussions are highlighted below.

Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Chairman Ajit Pai noted his commitment that all public safety communications fees need to go to strengthening the 911 system. However, according the latest reports on fee diversion, in one year, six States syphoned off more money than was spent on all NG911 projects combined.

Chairman Pai spoke about his recent visit to our client, Orleans Parish Communications District (OPCD) last week, and how impressed he was with their center's excellence. Specifically, he spoke of their commitment to increase location accuracy services for callers, improve well-being for their call takers, and establish a partnership with Uber. The Commissioner specifically mentioned OPCD Director Tyrell Morris, and his efforts to work with the Mayor on educational public safety initiatives. The Chairman mentioned a new SHOW-UP sign that was displayed prominently at OPCD, indicative of OPCD's commitment to the public safety community:

Another notable speaker at this event was Maryland Senator Cheryl Kagan, a nationally-recognized advocate for "Next Generation 911". Senator Kagan spoke of the need to "shift" to newer technology to bring our 9-1-1 system into line with modern technology, saying clearly, "when 9-1-1 fails, people die". She advised the 911 GTW attendees to not speak in "tech jargon" but instead provide memorable stories of how this upgrade will save lives. She told us that it was the death of a Maryland environmentalist and activist who was struck by lightning and didn't receive timely medical assistance due to a 9-1-1 failure that has made her so passionate on this topic. Senator Kagan has passed multiple pieces of 9-1-1 legislation in her state. She is the chair of the Maryland NG911 Commission, and spoke of their November 2018 report "Commission to Advance NG911 Across Maryland" with 23 unanimous recommendations for improvements in the state. Traditionally, cybersecurity has been a compliance-driven activity, with agencies focusing more on complying with regulations -- and showing they've done so -- than actually securing government from operational threats.

Today, the goal is to shift to operational security as the federal government works to modernize IT and improve efficiency. Modernization requires implementing cloud-based applications, but it adds complexity, making cybersecurity compliance even more onerous and confusing. Too often, agencies are left to make individual decisions based on their understanding of compliance as it relates to the cloud. For the mission areas, compliance is often viewed as an obstacle to go around, over or underneath.

DHS Requests Input for Updated National Emergency Communications Plan

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) is seeking feedback on proposed updates to the National Emergency Communications Plan (NECP), the strategic plan to improve emergency communications.

Informed by last year's SAFECOM nationwide survey, the NECP provides guidance to those who plan for, coordinate, invest in, and use communications to support response and recovery operations. This includes traditional emergency responder disciplines and other entities that share information during emergencies, such as medical facilities, utilities, nongovernmental organizations, and the media and private citizens.

No Clear Plans For Federal NG911 Legislation, But Funding Hope Remains, NENA Chief Says

Hope for legislation that would allocate billions in federal funding to help pay for 911 call centers' transition to IP-based, next-generation 911 (NG911) technology remains, although no NG911 bills currently are on the verge of being introduced, according to National Emergency Number Associations (NENA) CEO Brian Fontes.

"I think there's interest and support to improve 911 and next-generation 911," Fontes told IWCE's Urgent Communications yesterday. "Hopefully, we'll get legislation introduced in this Congress, and we'll see where it goes from there." Many in the public-safety community have debated whether NG911 funding has a better chance of passing as a standalone bill or as part of larger legislation. Proponents of the latter option note that the legislation that established the FirstNet initiative passed as part of a massive omnibus bill after failing to gain support as a standalone item.

Fontes said he is not sure what strategy would be best.

AT&T Officials Outline Current IoT Capabilities Over FirstNet, Future Considerations For LTE-M

FirstNet currently does not support the use of low-power, wide-area (LPWA) protocols like LTE-M, but the

nationwide public-safety broadband network can be leveraged for low-bandwidth Internet of Things (IoT) use cases with quality of service, priority and preemption (QPP) on LTE, according to AT&T officials.

David Allen, director of IoT advanced product development for AT&T—the nationwide contractor charged with building and maintaining FirstNet—said that devices using LPWA technologies like LTE-M and NB-IoT can have very long battery life by transmitting small amounts of data and then entering extended "sleep" cycles. In addition, these devices can transmit data repeatedly until the message is received, which effectively result in extended coverage.
