In honor of the 2023 National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week, **Winbourne Consulting, Inc.** would like to thank telecommunications personnel nationwide who serve our communities, citizens, and public safety personnel 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

I sat in the telecommunicator chair with that magic headset back in the days of basic 911 when we dispatched using paper cards and paper maps. We then moved to a CAD system and Enhanced 911, which were exciting improvements. Today's technology is even more impressive and constantly evolving to make the job of a telecommunicator better, faster, more efficient, and easier to protect the first responders and the citizens they serve.

The emotional and mentally draining side of dispatching has not changed as quickly as technology. During the last ten years, there has been a push to reclassify dispatchers from a clerical/secretarial status to a first responder classification like law enforcement officers, firefighters, rescue squads, and emergency medical service providers. In 2019, states began to modify their laws to include telecommunicators as first responders. Twenty states have changed their laws today, and the remaining push for that change, and recently, some states have added the recognition of PTSD to this classification

The reclassification makes sense to those telecommunicators who arrive the day before a hurricane and remain at their center during the storm and days after the storm, knowing they have family and friends in harm's way. These dedicated individuals also continued to work throughout the COVID pandemic, working tirelessly in very trying conditions.

Telecommunicators are the first voices a 911 caller hears on perhaps the worst day of

their life as they report their baby not breathing, a drive-by shooter just shot their son, or their mother seems to be having a heart attack and is not responding. Telecommunicators assess the situation and provide a calming voice to the caller until the first responders arrive.

Telecommunicators are the safety net for the first responders, dedicated to keeping them safe and ensuring they return home safely at the end of their shift.

I am constantly amazed and impressed by all of the telecommunicators I have met during my career in public safety. We at Winbourne Consulting would like to thank each of you for your hard work, dedication, resiliency, and commitment to this stressful and usually chaotic job.

HISTORY OF NATIONAL PUBLIC SAFETY TELECOMMUNICATIONS WEEK

National Public Safety Telecommunications Week was founded to honor the telecommunication personnel dedicating their lives to public safety. It was a local initiative that was initially set up in 1981 by Patricia Anderson of Contra Costa County, which later went on to become a nationwide, week-long event.

There's quite an interesting backstory that marked the establishment of the week. It goes something like this: Sheriff Rainey of the Contra Costa County wanted to treat all his administrative staff (then called secretaries) to lunch one afternoon, to show appreciation for their work, but did not realize that the administration's lines should never go

unanswered during business hours. At that time, it was a practice to forward all administration lines to dispatch after business hours, but the day Sheriff Rainy bought them lunch, the whole administration pushed their calls to dispatch at 11 am and recklessly left the building.

[Georgia] County recognizes first responders for their selfless service

Habersham County commissioners took a moment during their meeting Monday evening to recognize two Baldwin police officers and two E-911 operators for their selfless service to their community.

On December 21, 2022, E-911 Dispatcher Jaron Loggins learned of a call at the 911 center about a homeless man who needed blankets and supplies to keep warm during the cold weather event that occurred during the Christmas holidays. Loggins took his lunch break and met the gentleman at a local business and provided him with the requested supplies, which Loggins paid for out of his own pocket.

On January 26, 2023, E-911 Senior Dispatcher Kim Fauscett learned of a welfare check for an elderly caller who was without power and food at her Baldwin residence. Law enforcement was dispatched to that location and confirmed the woman needed help.

[Texas] Milam County Sheriff, 911 dispatchers lobby lawmakers for mental health leave



"In law enforcement, the dispatcher is our lifeline."

CAMERON, Texas (KBTX) - 911 dispatchers across the Lone Star State hope to be designated first responders through proposed **House Bill 1486.**

Despite being the first point of contact during emergencies, these telecommunication officers are not recognized as first responders like their peers.

House Bill 1486, introduced by Representative Stan Gerdes of House District 17, proposes to grant mental health leave for 911 telecommunicators and dispatchers.

This bill differs from **Senate Bill 1359**, which took effect on September 1, 2021, and requires law enforcement agencies to create and implement a mental health leave policy for peace officers who experience trauma on the job.

House Bill 1486 would require law enforcement and state agencies with full-time telecommunicators to implement mental health leave for those affected by workplace trauma. The bill would provide clear and objective guidelines establishing the circumstances under which a telecommunicator is granted and may use mental health leave, entitle a telecommunicator to mental health leave without a deduction in salary or other compensation, enumerate the number of mental health leave days available to a telecommunicator, and detail the level of anonymity for a telecommunicator who takes mental health leave.

[Illinois] Exclusive look at Cook County 911 dispatchers' quiet rooms

DES PLAINES, III. (WLS) -- We're going inside new state-of-the-art 'quiet' rooms for Cook County Sheriff's Office 911 dispatchers.

The rooms are designed to give dispatchers a break from the stress and demands of answering hours and hours of emergency calls, and ultimately benefit the people who call them for help.

Cook County Sheriff's police telecommunicator, Michelle Dorn, loves her job.

"They're gonna always remember when they had to call 911, so it's always good to be that person to help them through it -- who got them the help," Dorn said.

But at times, it can be mentally exhausting.

"We are pretty much the first first responder. So we get the initial calls of people screaming, the initial panic of situations that they're in," she said.

That's where brand new quiet rooms with light therapy at the Cook County 911 dispatch center in Des Plaines come in.

"If I've had a stressful day at work, be it a bad phone call or busy radio traffic with the officers, I can come back here and sit in a quiet room away from the noise in the hectic things that happened in the 911 center," Dorn said.

FGM Architects designed the Quiet Rooms and the Cook County Sheriff's Office says the firm connected them with Dr. Joel Robertson.

"If we let that physiology run and let it run without being able to back it down quickly, cortisol is released [and] adrenalin is released -- we've got cardiac disease," he said.

Over the last six years, total calls to Cook County dispatchers have nearly doubled to more than 700,000 in 2022.

In that same span, 911 emergency calls have nearly doubled as well to nearly 221,000 a year, according to the sheriff's office. Which is why Cook County Sheriff Tom Dart said these spaces to decompress are essential.

"The public will never understand what these people go through every day," Dart said of the dispatchers.

He said, due to consolidation, this center now dispatches for 14 other law enforcement agencies.

"In this case, bigger is somewhat better but with that though the pressures and the stress also go like this," he said. "And that's why these type of rooms really need to be sort of the norm."
